



Welcome to our yard! For generations, racing has been at the heart of the Easterby family, and it all started right here in this very yard. My father sent



s a dual-purpose yard, we have celebrated many incredible days under both codes. Barton was one of top hurdlers of his generation winning Grade 1s at both the Cheltenham and Aintree. In 2002, we won the oldest classic of them all, the St Leger, with Bollin Eric. Over the years, we have trained a number of Group 1 winners, including Pipalong, Fayr Jag, Somnus, Winter Power, and most recently, Art Power. I've also had the privilege of winning the award for the top trainer in Yorkshire on ten different occasions, something we are always extremely proud of.



2025 has been exceptional, with almost 100 winners on the board already, putting us on track for one of our best seasons ever. Our seasoned veterans have been in top form, with old favourites like Garden Oasis and Cruyff Turn winning more than their fair share. We've also had some exciting new talent emerge, including Argentine Tango, a top-class filly sired by our very own Mattmu, and Revival Power, who is owned by King Power.

Our success is truly a team effort. This is a real family-run operation, with two generations of Easterbys often on the gallops in the morning. My children, William, Emily, and Thomas, all play crucial roles, as does my wife Sarah. We are also incredibly fortunate to have brilliant and hardworking staff, from veterans who have been with us for many years to enthusiastic young members just starting their careers. In addition to our racing team, we have a team of farmers that produces all the hay, straw, and feed needed for our horses, ensuring they receive the best care. While you're here, I hope you take the time to appreciate these magnificent athletes up close. Seeing them in their stables, away from the racetrack, is a fantastic opportunity to witness their individual personalities.

If you're looking for a horse to follow for the rest of the year, I recommend keeping an eye on COUNT D'ORSAY. He's a horse who thrives on slow ground, which has been hard to come by this year. With the autumn coming, I'm confident he'll find his preferred conditions and have a strong end to the season.









#### CRAIG LIDSTER

Craig Lidster Racing, Beverley House Racing Stables, Norton, Malton, YO17 9PJ

Craig Lidster is becoming a familiar name on your race cards, and an even more prominent one in the winners' enclosure. His rising success in the game hasn't come overnight however, nor through any form of luck. The



Rotherham-born Sheffield Wednesday fan has been involved with racehorses since eleven years old, riding out Kevin Frost's horses, ponies and point-to-pointers. The love for the thoroughbred immediately blossomed, and further education came to an abrupt end as Craig left school at sixteen to enrol in the Racing School at the National Horseracing College in Doncaster.

fter developing a strong racing foundation at college, Craig's first job was with former trainer Jeremy Glover before moving on to work for the late Sir Robert Ogden, the leading jumps owner of the 1990s. There he worked with top-class horses such as Marlborough, a Cheltenham Festival winner and runner-up to Best Mate in the King George, and See More Business, a Gold Cup winner. Riding champions from a young age proved invaluable in teaching Craig to recognise the difference between top-class horses and those of lesser ability.

At Sir Robert Ogden's, Craig honed many of his strengths, particularly breaking in young horses — an attribute he remains especially proud of. After 18 months, he moved to Malton in 2000 to work for Malcolm Jefferson, and it has been his home for 22 years and counting. Ten of those years were with Brian Ellison, whom Craig calls his "second family". As travelling head lad, Ellison gave him his first ride as a jockey, though Craig quickly realised his skills lay more in training than race-riding, leading him to join Richard Fahey's yard.

With Fahey, Craig worked with outstanding horses, including now Coolmore stallion Wootton Bassett. His proudest moment was travelling Wootton Bassett to France for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe meeting, where he led up the colt to win the Group One Prix Jean-Luc Lagardère in 2010. Over eight years there, Craig further refined his flat racing knowledge, especially his passion and talent for breaking in young horses. That talent later saw him work with problem horses, requiring tailored care focused on mental rather than physical training. Alongside Cheltenham Festival-winning trainer Tim Etherington, Craig learned from renowned horseman Gary Witheford, eventually breaking in and pre-training such horses in the north of England. This period was crucial in paving the way for his own training career.

Within just over a decade, Craig had amassed an extraordinary breadth of equine knowledge. In late 2021, he launched his training career at Eboracum Racing Stables, Easingwold, quickly building a loyal owner base. On 14 June 2024, he achieved his biggest success to date with Alfa Kellenic winning at his local track, York, under apprentice William Pyle. A month later, Finn Ironside added another York win. Alfa Kellenic then secured a five-timer in the Class Two Fillies Handicap at the prestigious Ebor Festival, before landing a six-timer by taking the Ayr Silver Cup in track record time. Her rise from a rating of 70 to 101 and over £120,000 in prize money reflected Craig's patient, precise training.

In 2024, Craig trained 35 winners, up from 26 in 2023, with 47% of runners placing in the top four and over £500,000 earned for owners. In 2025, he faces perhaps his biggest challenge yet — now based at Beverley House Stables, Malton, overlooking the historic Highfield Gallops, where multiple Classic winners have trained, including those of Captain Charles

Elsey, the only Northern trainer in the last century to hold that distinction. Craig aspires to similar success.

Already in 2025, he has celebrated another York win with BillyB and aims for more local triumphs. Above all, Craig is a family man, supported unfailingly by his wife Laura, a key part of the Lidster team, and their daughters Ava and Ella.

Musley Bank has sent out, and continues to send out, many a top-class racehorse. Spirit Dancer has been the yard's most recent flagbearer winning the Bahrain International Trophy. Richard has trained over 70 individual Group and Listed winners,



spearheaded by Group 1 winners Wootton Bassett, Ribchester, Mayson, Sands Of Mali, Garswood, Perfect Power and The Platinum Queen. The yard is always looking for the next champion, and with some very exciting horses to look forward to, the future looks bright.

Richard reflects; I have been fortunate through my career to have trained the number of winners we have. I am extremely proud to be one of a very select number of British trainers to reach 3,000 winners.

Those 3,000 winners have been mucked out, groomed and led up by our fantastic team of staff. Industry leading in their work ethic, and showing dedication to the horses in their charge. It is thanks to their efforts that Richard Fahey Racing has, and can continue to achieve, its goals and aspirations.

Success also comes through having the correct facilities. Our yard boasts a mile long gallop, indoor school, lunge ring, veterinary unit, equine spa, two treadmills, seven horse walkers and several turn out paddocks for the horses to enjoy a pick of grass. These facilities can all be viewed during the annual ARC Malton Open Day.

ere at Newstart Racing we have continued to be busy, working through a patient start to the 2025 racing season, building up to an exciting future ahead. We have new horses in our team who we are working with this year, and we have already seen plenty of positives with their potential, both at home and on the racecourse.

We had a lovely day at the Doncaster Races for one of their Summer Saturday meetings, just a few weeks ago. Our owners and working team all had such an enjoyable day's racing. Please do come along and meet our team, as now would be a great time to join in the fun as our new horses start to flourish. If you join our team, you can get the excitement of watching the horses work at home, and meeting and speaking to the jockeys on race days, before they ride our horses.

At the races, it's great to be able to make connections with some of the best jockeys available. When they can win or finish within the winners' enclosure, on their first ride for us, it just strengthens our opportunities as the season goes on.

At Newstart Racing our string started in 2011 with four horses of mixed age, ability and previous form. From an early age, I was working with the Yorkshire based show jumping Whitaker brothers, and it was a tough but rewarding decision to move into the world of racing once my school education finished. I rode at many of the UK racetracks as an apprentice jockey, gaining the thrill, excitement, and valuable knowledge of riding winners, before my race riding career ended in 2007, with 17 winners.

Newstart Racing is based in a small, but tidy, well-equipped yard that is run with great support from family, friends, and highly respected successful local trainers from around the UK. Our horses are always given the individual time and attention they need to perform to their maximum.

Aaron James is our assistant trainer. We work together to get the horses ready for





the racecourse and Aaron, when riding as an amateur jockey, rode our first winner in 2012 on a lovely Gelding we had with us, 'Stamp Duty'. We still get regular updates on 'Stampie's' adventures as he has moved away for a relaxed lifestyle, since he retired from racing. We know our horses are happy doing what they do, and we have plenty of exciting times to look forward to. We like to treat our horses as individuals, and they all get that oneto-one attention which they love and deserve. Why would you not want to be involved!? We have horses with percentage shares available for ownership within 'Newstart Racing' so it's certainly worth checking out our competitive ownership options and finding out just how easy it can be to become a racehorse owner with enjoyable involvement and days at the races too. You can get involved, come and see them in preparation and then watch them at the racetrack and take the chance to be in the winners' enclosure with your horse and jockey!

We are also proud to have our teenager, 17-years-young, Ad Vitam, who retired from racing on New Year's Eve, 2020. While running 100 times under rules, he has won four times for us, and has been placed in the top four places in 50 of those 100 races! He still stands here with us now and helps educate the younger members of the team. He's become a bit of a local celebrity when his assistance is required with stalls work on the local Langton Wold gallops, for us and other local trainers. We have a great team to work with and it's definitely worth a visit to see them, and the extra company we have of our Chocolate Ryeland sheep – Toffee & Rolo, not to mention our Pigmys, Rodney and Trotter!

Originally from Ireland, where he began his training career, Adrian Keatley has now been based in the UK for five years, training both Flat and National Hunt horses. During his time here, the yard has continued to grow as the business has gone from strength to strength.



ur ethos is 'quality over quantity', preferring to run a smaller operation of quality horses who can, and do, win races. Each and every animal in our care is given the hands-on trainer's full attention each day, and visitors often remark on how happy and relaxed the horses are, whether in their stables, on the gallops, or at the racecourse.

Adrian's time in Ireland set him up with a strong reputation for his capability in selecting and preparing a racehorse for the big prizes, having trained Jet Setting to win the Group 1 Irish 1,000 Guineas in 2016 – hopefully the first of many Classic victories!

During his time training in Malton, Adrian's sharp eye for a horse has been brilliantly showcased by the likes of Legendary Day and Kihavah, who – both purchased for only £8,500 at auction – have amassed £100,000 and £175,000 in prize money respectively while in training with us.

This year is proving to be another productive one across both codes, with a strong strike rate over jumps and exciting results from the two-year-olds on the Flat. Nearly all of them have already shown their ability by getting their heads in front.

You might already be familiar with the gold and green striped silks of the Keatley Owners Group, which have been carried to victory numerous times, but we always have small shares available in classy horses, so don't hesitate to get in touch or ask us about it on the day.





ohn has been training for 38 years with mostly flat horses but a good amount of jumpers too. Situated in the centre of the gallops with 15 stables we do our best to keep horses sweet with plenty of turnout and varied work.

With a keen interest in other equestrian disciplines we try to incorporate this to our advantage. Welfare, care and attention to detail of each horse are hugely important to us.

We started off the new year well with Elettaria winning in January and Biplane winning in February, we always aim to have runners on the all-weather through the winter. Eeetee was our first turf winner, who subsequently won again and Dandys Angel hit form to win at her favourite track Beverley, her 11th career win in total. Elettaria then won again this year at Newcastle.

We hope to get over 10 winners by the end of the year, we often have a very good strike rate.

We always have space to take in new horses and welcome new owners and we have various syndicates and shares available if you wish to become involved! Please come and join us for a drink and meet our team!







ick first took out his licence to train racehorses in 1961 and sent out his first winner in April 1961 when Great Rock won at Edinburgh. Literally thousands of winners followed suit, including Classic winning filly Mrs McArdy (1,000 Guineas, 1977), sprinters Lochnager (Champion sprinter 1976) and Wiganthorpe (Gimcrack Stakes, 1986) and Hoof It (Stewards Cup 2011 and Stewards Sprint 2016). Mick Easterby has sent out over 2,600 winners and although now predominantly a flat yard, approximately 650 of these successes have come over jumps.

Mick and David have an amazing ability to spot a bargain. Mick's bargain buys have gone on to win many races, including Lochnager, who was champion sprinter in 1976 after being purchased for just a few hundred guineas. Mick's Classic winning filly Mrs McArdy had been bought as part of a job lot of horses before winning the 1,000 Guineas and being sold on to race in the United States for over 150,000 guineas, setting a record at the Tattersalls sales. The yard has also seen much success from the many homebred winners which have been sent out from New House Farm. Recent winners Alpha Magic, Acrisius and So Grateful were all bred here from winning mares and have continued the procession of home-bred successes that span over half a century.

There are currently around a hundred horses in training at New House Farm with Yorkshire Lady, Sondad, Canon's House and Two Brothers

amongst the well-known names currently racing.
We're never afraid to travel to find success and

this year our owners have enjoyed success at some of Britain's top tracks, with victories at Ascot and also Epsom on Derby Day.

Mick and David ensure that every horse in their stable receives first class care. After morning training, and weather permitting, horses are turned out in the paddocks to enjoy their freedom and the fresh air.

"Happy horses are winning horses" is a phrase often used at the stables. Racehorse welfare is paramount and this will be immediately apparent to those who visit the yard during the course of the Malton Open Day. Once the racing careers of the horses are over, we pride ourselves in our rehoming programme where we find the horses new careers and homes. In recent years our ex-racehorses have gone on to enjoy careers in eventing (such as Soft Summer Rain and Oneforthenotebook), polo (Bottleared, Furze Boy), horseball (Restive) whilst others have been successful in the show ring. Some horses are taken on as riding horses and enjoy life hacking around the countryside. Horses have been rehomed to all corners of the British Isles as far afield as Cornwall, Kent, Wales and Scotland.

Mick and David have a number of syndicates which provide affordable racehorse ownership for all budgets. The Laura Mason Syndicate has now sent out over 30 winners with Refuge and King of The Jungle amongst the many horses

carrying their blue and yellow silks to victory. The Racing Club are represented by multiple winners So Grateful and Yorkstone whilst we also run the annual 100 and 50 Clubs.

New House Farm is also a working arable farm. The fields around the stables grow a range of crops, such as wheat, barley, peas, beans and of course oats and hay. The farm is managed alongside nature, with areas of land set aside for wildflower meadows which provide nectar and pollen for our 'Easterbees Honey', whilst ponds and woodlands

also feature within the landscape of the farm.

# Mike stated he fell into racing by accident, a hobby which turned into a living (just).

ike's background with horses started in showjumping as a young man, before changing to team chasing, which he enjoyed and realised he got an adrenaline kick from going fast over big fences. So, it was no surprise that Mike decided to have a go at the point-to-point circuit, becoming both jockey and trainer. Mike's career in point-to-point was outstanding, earning him both champion jockey and trainer, which is no mean feat in a very competitive sport.

Although from a farming background, Mike decided to turn professional and take out his combined training licence, originally training in East Yorkshire for many years, but then in February 2020, he relocated to Oak Lea Farm, Little Barugh, Malton. This venue provides Mike with three large barns and 16 acres of grassland which he grazes as well as makes haylage for the horses. The facilities at Oak Lee Farm include 1 ½ furlong canter circle, lunge pen, horse walker and 22 small individual paddocks, which Mike uses every day to turn the horses out. Mike likes his horses to be turned out - it relaxes them, helps them socialise, lets the horses have a roll and stretch their legs. The barns are light and airy, American style and with plenty of space due to the size of the shed, the horses have plenty to see and watch. Everything is under cover, which is helpful in the Yorkshire winter for both horses and staff.

Mike believes in simplistic feeding and keeping his horses as near to nature as possible. Mike has 17 horses in training, and as he is part of the team working with them every day, he knows each horse individually, and this improves their care. His attention to detail is outstanding.

Through his career, Mike has had some highlights in racing, winning a Hunter Chase at Cheltenham, ridden by the late Howard Brown is one cherished memory, Mike was injured and unable to ride the horse.

However, Mike states the big courses such as Aintree and Cheltenham are wonderful to have winners at, but he still finds winning on local tracks as special, mainly because local people are there to share the excitement. Mike's favourite racecourse is Market Rasen.

Mike thanks his team, without whom he would not be able to run such an excellent yard. Mike has Harrison working for him every morning, who Mike states has potential, gives Mike a new lease of life and encourages each other to get the job done. Thank you to Sally, Tracey, Elaine and everyone else who supports Mike.

Mike will be there on the day to welcome you, and to answer any of your questions.


